- 3. Sylvia Plath- 'Daddy' Is a representative feminist text that questions patriarchal authority in esoteric ways.
- 4. Christina Rossetti- The Goblin Market, Jane Austen- Pride and Prejudice, Charlotte Bronte- Jane Eyre --- are representative feminist written by female poet and novelists that deal with social position of women, and sexual identity.

Emily Dickinson- 'I cannot live with you', Alice Walker- The Color Purple, Emily Bronte-Wuthering Heights, Mahasweta Devi-'Draupadi', Katherine Mansfield- 'Bliss', Mary Wollstonecraft- A Vindication of the Rights of Woman, Chapters I & II, Rassundari Devi-Amar Jiban --- are representative feminist written by female writers that deal with social position of women in a patriarchal society and sexual identity.
- 6. Henrik Ibsen A Doll's House --- is concerned with the problem of women's position in society.
- 7. Toru Dutt- 'Our Casuarina Tree' A.K. Ramanujan- 'River' --- are dealing with nature and its bond with human beings considering these texts from ecocritical point of view.
