REASONS FOR MAPPING

1. Introductory Sociology I is about several basic concepts in Sociology like norms, values, socialization, conformity, deviance and others which represents Human values.
2. Sociology of India-I discusses social issues like caste, solidarity, principles of kinship and religion in Indian society which maps with human values.
3. Introductory Sociology- II includes topics like feminist perspective in sociology and hence represents gender.
4. Sociology of India-II includes topics like Women's movement
5. Sociology of India-II discusses several issues like the Dalits, untouchability, social movements, communalism and secularism which represents human values.
6. Sociology of Religion includes diversity in religion and identity like class, sexuality and gender.
7. Sociology of Religion includes concepts like sacred, profane, rationality, religious pluralism which maps human values.
8. Sociology of Gender and Sexuality

9. Reading, Writing and Interpretation in Sociology discusses techniques of reading, writing, borrowing material and also issues like plagiarism which maps with professional ethics.
10. Gender Sensitization.
11. Economic Sociology discusses contemporary issues like development and globalization which maps with issues of environment and sustainability.
12. Population Studies discusses issues like culture and fertility, women, family and reproductive technologies.
13. Social Stratification includes topics like feminism and gendered stratification.
14. Statistical Reasoning for Sociology represents ethical practices in conducting social research.
15. Theory and Practice of Development includes topics like sustainability, gender, corporate social responsibility which maps with issues like gender, human values and environmental sustainability.
16. Research Methods I represents ethical practices in conducting research and feminist methods as a part of gender issues.
17. Urban Sociology represents environment and sustainability through topics like ecological perspective, smart cities, movements and settlement issues and urban space problems.
18. Sociology of Work and Industry discusses topics like work and occupation, industrial sector, women's work in labour force, paid and unpaid labour, gender discrimination, industrial hazards, risk and disaster which maps with issues of professional ethics, gender, environment and sustainability.
19. Indian Sociological Traditions includes topics like Radhakamal Mukherjee's personality, society and values representing human values and gender issues like Irawati Karve's Gender and kinship and Leela Dube's caste and gender.
20. Sociology of Visual Culture and Media discusses issues pertaining to visual practices, identity and information which maps with issues of professional ethics.
21. Research Methods-II represents ethical practices in conducting research.
22. Environmental Sociology discusses topics related to the environment, eco feminism as well as social movements which represents gender, human values and environment and sustainability.
23. Agrarian Sociology includes topics like caste, gender and agrarian realities.
24. Sociology of Health and Medicine includes topics related to medical ethics and feminist approach to health and illness.
25. Project: Fieldwork and Dissertation is a practical course which represents all the issues related to professional ethics, gender, human values and also environment and sustainability.
