The primary objective of the Department in organising this film-screening programme was to help students develop a fair sense of the place of history in the wider popular culture. The Department sought to provide exposure to the students to the use of historical settings in films, along with the varied representations of historical facts and characters in the domain of popular entertainment. The idea was to orient students towards the intertwining of the realms of history, popular culture and entertainment. The films were selected keeping in mind the courses prescribed in the syllabus. Paddington is based on the theme of geographical exploration, colonialism and overseas exploitation which are part of the courses taught in History Hons CC VI in Semester III. The Great Dictator and The Sound of Music are set against the backdrop of the rise of fascism and dictatorship in Europe, a compulsory course in History Hons CC 11 and History General DSE A2 in Semester V.

The participants during the film screenings included not just the students of the Department of History but also students from other departments of the college. The response that the Department received for the film-screening programme was impressive. Students whole heartedly participated in the programme and thoroughly

enjoyed the films. Students even requested for more such film screenings in the future.

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
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
Department of Bengali
