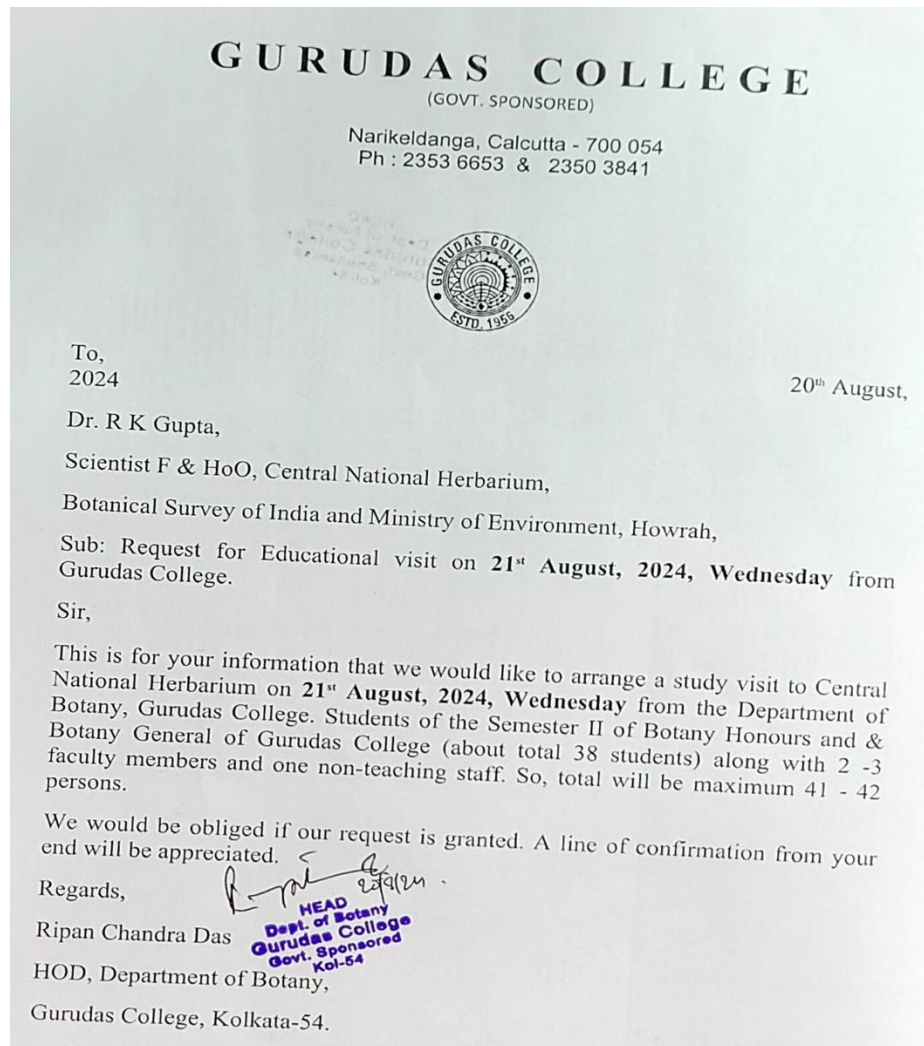

The Department of Botany organized yet another experiential learning trip to the **Acharya Jagadish Chandra Bose Indian Botanic Garden** on **August 21<sup>st</sup>, 2024**.
